

The field in the North Carolina Venue was 50% greater than the prior year, sound indication that our organization is doing well again after a few years of declining participation. A special thanks is due Bill Durmer for his efforts with constant contact and Jim Brock for his development of our new web page, "USGFR.com." We would like to also thank all the Greensboro local Rotarians who worked to make our 2012 tournament a big success.

The Grandover Resort in Greensboro was a first-class venue, providing quality rooms, extraordinary food and two excellent golf courses to test our best players. Dupont Kirven, a North Carolina Rotarian, proudly displays his championship trophy after 3 rounds of quality play.

Patrick Eakes and Director Pat Clark are responsible for organizing this very successful tournament. The USGFR Board of Directors has appointed Patrick Eakes as "Director at Large" to capture his superb organizational skills and enthusiasm for the United States Golfing Fellowship of Rotarians.

Hello all USGFR members and friends!

Nothing could be finer! The North Carolina saying proved to be true as the 23rd annual USGFR national championships visited the truly grand Grandover Resort in Greensboro. Tournament chair Patrick Eakes left no stone unturned in organizing a fabulous event. Thanks to Patrick, his committee, and the Crescent Rotary Club.

At the annual meeting of the USGFR Executive Committee, we took several actions:

- Changed the top tournament award to designate two national champions: the gross stableford winner from Division I and the net stableford winner from any division.
- Established a Director at Large position and elected Patrick Eakes to that post.
- Changed the annual dues to \$25 per year effective January 1, 2013.
- Agreed to set up a PayPal account for accepting credit card payments for membership.
- Elected Bill Durmer to the position of President-Elect; he will take office following the 2013 tournament.
- Selected Perdido Beach Resort, Gulf Shores, Alabama, as the headquarters for the 2014 tournament to be held in late April/early May.

- Agreed to accept proposals from any club/region interested in hosting a USGFR venue, even if that location deviates from the currently established venue rotation schedule.

Membership in USGFR currently numbers 308. Of that number 168 are lifetime members and 140 are annual members. As always, we encourage ALL members to help promote membership and participation in USGFR. Refer your Rotarian golfer acquaintances to the fellowship website, bring them along with you to the next tournament, and explain to them the value of lifelong friendships made. Oh yes, there's always the fun of playing golf!

Past President Ray Taylor and his lovely wife, Betty, joined us in Greensboro. Ray has championed the cause of Rotary golf for many years and is a wonderful ambassador of our fellowship. Thanks for coming to Greensboro, Ray and Betty!

Sadly, two of our members passed away in the past year, and our sympathy goes out to their families: PRID Sam Greene and Gerry Sutton.

I hope to see all of you in Indian Wells next May. In the meantime, good health and good golfing.

The 24th Annual Venue in Palm Springs, California in 2013 will be my last as East Region Director but Dolores and I look forward to meeting many of you there for the first time.



It is with great sadness that we announce the loss of a longtime USGFR member, Marlowe LeBarge, on September 3, 2012.

Marlowe John LeBarge, 84, of Cat Mousam Road, died peacefully early Monday morning, September 3, 2012 at Gosnell Memorial Hospice House in Scarborough surrounded by his loving family. He was born in Kennebunk on September 7, 1927, the son of John B. and Frances R. (Bragg) LeBarge. He grew up and was educated locally, graduating from Kennebunk High School, Class of 1945.

He was a former member and past president of the Kennebunk Rotary Club, where he had perfect attendance for 50 years, and was recognized as a Paul Harris Fellow. He served as Director, Region One, United States Golfing Fellowship of Rotary, and his team won the 1st U.S. National Championship Golf Tournament in 1990.


